Biography

José Manuel Guerreiro Arsénio was born on 17 May 1960, at the Sines hospital. Born in the parish of Sines, has always lived in Porto Covo.

He was a bank employee for 31 years. He started to work in 1982 at the former Banco Fonsecas and Burnay (currently BPI) in Sines. In 1991, he joined the Mutual Agricultural Credit Bank of Santiago do Cacém, having worked at the agencies of Santiago do Cacém, Sines, Porto Covo (opening of the agency) and Cercal do Alentejo (until 2013, when he took office as municipal councillor of Sines).

Mr. José Arsénio worked at SOPOL (1979 -1980), TONUS/METALSUL (1980) and CNP - National Petrochemical Company (1980-1982).

He was a member of the Porto Covo Parish Commission in 1984 (PS), secretary of the Porto Covo Parish Council from 2002 to 2005 (PS) and president of the Porto Covo Parish Council from 2005 to 2009 (PS). He was an athlete at several clubs in the region and managed the Porto Covo Sports and Recreational Club (1996-2004).

During his career as an associative director, he was director (1990-1991) and president of



the General Assembly (1994-2004) of the Porto Covo Sports and Recreational Club.

He was a founding partner of the Porto Covo Housing Cooperative, in 1983.

Mr. José Arsénio presided the Board of the General Assembly (2003-2007) and was a member of the Supervisory Board (2007-2013) of the Association "A Gralha". He was also secretary of the fiscal councils of Santa Casa da Misericórdia de Sines and Casa do Benfica de Sines.
